The bocce courts at the Wickliffe Italian-American Club have a reputation as being some of the best in the country, as was detailed in the recent documentary – Breaking Balls, which screened at the Cleveland International Film Festival this spring. With 9 fully covered courts, the Club is a magnet for bocce leagues that have been growing in popularity over the last few years. Our club is the home for five different

leagues: Monday afternoon (Italian Sons & Daughters # 192 League), Monday evening (Holy Redeemer league), Tuesday (Highland Hts. League), Wednesday (the Club's mixed couples league), and Thursday (the Club's men's league). Most of the leagues begin play in May and some run all the way through September. CLEVELAND CHALLENGE CUP OF BOCCE: AUGUST 25-27

The Wickliffe Italian-American Club is thrilled to announce that the 34th Annual Pat O'Brien Chevrolet / Cleveland Challenge Cup of Bocce will be held this year on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday August 25th, 26th and 27th at the Club's world class facilities, located at 29717 Euclid Avenue, Wickliffe, Ohio 44092. The event features 96 competing bocce teams from Ohio, New York, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Massachussets, Illinois, Michigan, Maryland, Florida, Mississippi, California, and Canada! Last year's winner was the local Adelio's Contracting team, consisting of players in their early to mid 30's from the eastern suburbs of Cleveland, playing in only their 2nd tournament together.

The event has become much more than a bocce tournament however, as the weekend is filled with a variety of entertainment, cultural activities, food vendors, activities for children and an overall family friendly atmosphere. Various members of the Lake County Visitors Bureau, which awards grants each year to organizations that attract visitors from outside the county, have made such comments about the event as:

The last few years have seen local teams rise to the forefront despite competing against some of the best teams in the country and internationally.
