35TH ANNUAL CLEVELAND CHALLENGE CUP OF BOCCE SET FOR AUGUST 24-26TH

Wickliffe Club celebrates the 35th anniversary of the Cleveland Challenge Cup of Bocce tournament this year over the August 24th-26th weekend as the club prepares to showcase it's beautiful facility to an expected crowd of 12,000 people over the 3-day event. The field is capped out at 96 teams in the Open Division, and has already filled over 80 spots as of mid-July. Tournament Co-Directors, Paul Dicicco and Vince Continenza expect both the Open and the Women's division to sell out before August 1st.

The tournament features 96 teams

competing for over \$20,000 in prize money, and attracts players from Ohio, New York, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Massachussetts, Illinois, Michigan, Maryland, Florida, Mississippi, California, and Canada and is acclaimed to be not only the biggest tournament in the Midwest, but also the best run. Last year's Open Division champions

was local Vandra Brothers team. They will be returning to defend their title again along with the Women's Division Champs, Formica Plumbing from Wickliffe, Ohio.

This year marks a turning point for the Club, as long time Tournament Director and President/Emeritus, Gino Latessa, has stepped back (though still involved), and has passed the torch to Paul Dicicco and Vince Continenza to carry on the tradition of coordinating all the various elements that go into putting on an event of this magnitude. Other veteran club members who have been involved in various aspects of the tournament such as Media Director - Larry Koval, and Bar Director - Randy Continenza, are also grooming younger club members to take over their roles in the near future as the club looks to have an orderly process so as to continue the tradition of excellence that they have become known for.

The opening ceremonies will begin at

5:30 p.m. on Friday, August 24th, with the national anthem of the USA, Italy, and Canada being sung by Giovanni Castiglione of Solon. Tournament play begins directly afterward and will run continuously through Sunday night on the nine covered bocce courts. The Club will present the top 12 teams with cash prizes totaling \$20,750. Entertainment will run throughout the weekend in the covered Saturday also features cultural pavilion. activities from noon to 3 p.m., hosted by Angie Spitalieri from La Gazzetta Italian Newspaper. Sunday is Family Day and will once again feature a variety of entertainment and activities for children including Magician Rick Smith Jr.; an appearance by "Jungle Terry", and DJ Dave spinning music. A wide variety of food vendors will provide homemade Italian food and specialty dishes as well as traditional American fare. The event is partially funded with a grant from the Lake County Visitors Bureau.


