While Cleveland Country Magazine's Spotlighted band Yosemite Slim brought a rural and western vibe to the event. Plus, for those really looking to mellow-out, local favorite Easy Glistening brought back the 'Yacht Rock' sound of the 70s and 80s.

REACHING FOR RECOVERY EVENT AIDS ADDICTION FACILITIES

Wickliffe Italian/American Club Members, Russ Meraglio and Gino Latessa, lost their sons to drug overdoses. Shortly after Russ' son, Ryan, passed in October, 2017, they created the nonprofit "Fight the Urge, Inc." to combat drug addiction and to support self-supporting treatment/rehab facilities. They scheduled their inaugural

They scheduled their inaugural fundraising event, Reaching for Recovery, on July 28th at the Wickliffe Italian American Club. The mission was to provide financial support to self-supporting sober homes that

provide a safe, sober living environment with a strong rehabilitation aspect.

Over 300 people attended the event and enjoyed a BBQ dinner, ice cream truck, reverse raffle, and a Chinese auction. The proceeds received allowed Fight the Urge, Inc. to distribute \$15,000.00 each to Friends of Recovery, Northeast Ohio, and The K.I.S.S. Foundation. The checks were presented shortly after the fundraising event and the proceeds will benefit the Tikvah Home, Willoughby, Ohio and The Lia House and Ronnie's House in Cleveland, Ohio.

Other members of the Italian American Club have also lost their children and grandchildren to addiction and they were remembered at the event. Gino and Russ plan to make this an annual event. It is their hope to reach out to other organizations for support and to establish new sober homes in Lake County, Ohio in the future.

They were grateful to all support they received whether from large or small donors to make the inaugural event a success, and especially the assistance from the Italian/American Club.
