That would set up the rematch to determine the 2019 Champion.

Once again, the game went back and forth early, and Utica went out to a 3-1 lead. From there, ABV went on an 11-0 run, eventually winning by a score of 16-4. That makes them 3-time champions at the Cleveland Challenge Cup of Bocce, having won back-to-back in 2014 and 2015.
